BRIEF OVERVIEW ON THE PROJECT AND TIMELINE

The development of affordable housing for seniors at Haywood House through the Low Income Housing Tax Credit Program is the result of over 12 years of hard work and collaboration between the Newton Housing Authority and all our wonderful partners.

After completing initial development feasibility analysis in 2010, the NHA assembled an experienced development team and received a Comprehensive Permit from the Newton Zoning Board of Appeals in July 2018 and a LIHTC funding award from EOHLC in 2020. Construction of Haywood House began in 2021.

Haywood House consists of 55 one-bedroom units, as well as fitness, laundry, and community space for social services and recreational programming.

HAYWOOD HOUSE RIBBON CUTTING CEREMONY



COMMEMORATING REVEREND HOWARD HAYWOOD

Haywood House is named in honor of Reverend Howard Haywood, a beloved member of the Newton community and a fierce advocate for affordable housing and social justice. Reverend Haywood was pastor of the historic Myrtle Baptist Church for many years and active in numerous community organizations in his hometown of Newton.

Reverend Haywood served on the Newton Housing Authority Board of Commissioners for over ten years and was instrumental in the development of Haywood House.

His work continues to have a lasting impact on the development of affordable housing in Newton and its residents.
